memory anymore to newcomers in Bronzeville, but somehow its value has been lost to the likes of the Harold Washington Cultural Center, now turned into the Tillman Pamily Profit Center; which marginalizes Chicago's history. And no one utters a word about the site which once stood as The Regal Room. That makes me sad because people like Tim Black, our neighborhood historian, knows the price we pay when we lose our past.

Earlier this year, the Ray Kroc Recreation Center was proposed and supported by John Blair of the Bronzeville Chamber of Commerce. It was to be built on the historic landsite at Robert Taylor on State Street. But it too was rejected and ushered away by the 3rd Ward political machine never to be considered again. It now belongs to another historic community, the Pullman area, and I'm certain that they will cherish the value of history forever.
